Introduction

1. Founded in 12 Nov 1964, Sainik School Goalpara is a residential School for boys. It provides public school education with a military orientation. It is a member of Indian Public Schools Conference (IPSC) and is affiliated to the All India Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE).

Aim

3. The primary aim of the School is to prepare boys academically, physically and psychologically for entry into the National Defence Academy (NDA). The all round education provided in the School, fully equips a student to pursue any other career with distinction. A sound character, esprit-de-corps, dedication, patriotic outlook and desire to serve the country are the qualities which Sainik Schools seek to promote.

4. The objectives of the School are :-

- (a) To remove regional imbalance in the officer cadre of the Defence Services.
- (b) To develop qualities of body, mind and character. This will ensure the young boys of today to become good and useful citizens of tomorrow.
- (c) To bring Public School education within the reach of common man.

Location

5. The School is located on Goalpara-Matia-Dudhnoi Road, 18 Kms away from Goalpara town, near village Mornai and adjacent to village Rajapara.

(b) By Rail School is about 25 kms from Goalpara Railway Station. Taxi and auto services are available from railway station to the School.

Administration

6. Sainik School Goalpara is one of the 28 Sainik Schools in the nation administered by Sainik Schools Society under Ministry of Defence, Government of India. A Board of Governors (BOG) under the Chairmanship of Defence Minister is the Chief Executive Body of the Sainik Schools Society. An Executive Committee under the chairmanship of Defence Secretary exercises closer control and supervision over the affairs of Sainik Schools. An officer of MoD nominated to function as Honorary Secretary supervises and co-ordinates the regular function of the Sainik Schools.



7. A Local Board of Administration (LBA) under the chairmanship of General Officer Commanding, Head Quarters 51 Sub Area, reviews and supervises the functioning of the school. The Principal is the Chief Executive and Academic head of the school. He is appointed by the Chairman, Board of Governors and is responsible to Board of Governors and to Local Board of Administration for effective command and control, efficient administration and optimum training efficiency of the institution. He is assisted in his responsibilities by the Vice Principal and the Administrative Officer who head the academic and administrative wings respectively. The Principal, Vice Principal and Administrative Officer are Officers of the Indian Armed Forces.

Staff

9. The School has trained and highly qualified academic, training and administrative staff in various areas of expertise.

Academics

10. The School conducts classes from Class VI to XII. The medium of instruction is English. Instructions in Class XI and XII are imparted only in the Science stream (Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, Biology/Computer Science). The School prepares the boys for the following examinations :-

- (a) Class X, All India Secondary School Examination (AISSE) under 10+2 pattern of Education
- (b) Class XII, All India Senior School Certificate Examination (AISSCE)
- (c) Union Public Service Commission (UPSC) Examination for admission to the National Defence Academy (NDA)

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(d) Preparation for Service Selection Boards to join the Armed Forces.



11. The school has excelled in its primary role as a feeder institution to the Armed Forces and has over 300 ex-Sainik School Goalpara students (SSGians) to its credit as officers in the Armed Forces through NDA/OTA/IMA/AFA/INA entries. A good number of ex-students are senior officers in IAS, IPS, Doctors, Engineers, Scientists, Software Professionals etc. serving not only in India but also abroad.



Physical Training and Games

12. It is obligatory for all boys to take part in physical training including games. NCC is compulsory for all boys. Qualified Physical Training Instructors from Army are posted in the school who methodically conduct physical training and games in the school. The school has adequate number of playgrounds.

Library

13. The School has a well-equipped library and a well-furnished reading room. The library subscribes to a large number of Educational Magazines, Periodicals, Newspapers, books on personality development and motivational reading material. Besides, the library houses all types of latest study material required for NDA entrance examination and other educational competitions conducted by various Schools of CBSE and IPSC. Boys are encouraged to get abreast with the day-to-day national and international news by reading current affairs magazines available in the reading room.



Computer Lab

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14. The school has two well equipped Computer Labs with internet facilities. It is obligatory on part of the boys to learn computer. Computer Education is an integral part of academics. All the cadets of VI to XII are exposed to computer and its application in day-to-day life.

15. Facilities are provided for pursuing a large number of hobbies each monitored by a Master. The meetings of the hobby clubs are organised once a week.

- 16. A large number of activities, such as debates, declamations, dramatics, public speaking etc. are held regularly throughout the year. Boys are encouraged to participate in inter-house as well as in intraschool competitions and contests.
 - (a) Academics : Debate, Recitation, Painting, Essay Writing, Story Writing, Mock-Parliament, Quiz etc.
 - (b) <u>Games & Sports</u> : Football, Hockey, Volleyball, Basketball, Obstacles, Athletics, Cross-Country, Swimming etc.

17. <u>Representation</u>: SSG cadets participate in various academic competitions and games & sports tournaments all over the country. They are also nominated to go to foreign countries under Youth Exchange Programme of NCC. Efforts are made to send boys for excursions / educational tours to important defence establishments.

National Cadets Corps

18. By virtue of gaining admission to Sainik School, every boy automatically becomes a member of the Junior Division of the National Cadet Corps, and has to take part in parade and other NCC activities and various courses conducted all over India. Various activities are conducted to train and award NCC A & B certificates to the cadets.



- (a) Annual Training Camp

Cadets Participation in School Activities



19. Students participate effectively in the management of their Houses, Cadets' Mess, Games, Sports, Cultural activities, Clubs etc. Suggestion boxes have been placed in the school building and cadets' mess for cadets to drop their suggestions. The suggestions made by the cadets are given due consideration by the School authorities. Boys from senior classes are given school appointments to exercise their organizing ability and develop qualities of leadership.

Houses

20. The boys live in Houses. The school has eight houses :

- (a) Senior Houses (Classes X to XII) : Lachit, Lohit, Udaygiri
- (b) Junior Houses (Clases VIII & IX) : Chilarai, Aniruddha & Ekalavya
- (c) Sub-Jr Houses (Class VI & VII) : Abhimanyu & Bhaskar

21. Each House has a House Master to look after the house affairs. The House Master and Hostel Superintendents (for Senior and Junior Houses) and Matrons (for Sub-Jr Houses) stay in the House. Each House also has Masters attached to it and Tutors to assist the boys in their studies and other activities. The House Masters look after the personal comfort and welfare of the boys. The Hostel Superintendents/Matrons look after and supervise housing and personal hygiene of the boys.

Cadets Mess

22. Boys have their meals in a spacious common dining hall. Both vegetarian and non-vegetarian food are served in the Mess. Masters of the school dine with the boys. Due care is taken to provide a balanced and nourishing diet to all the boys. Boys themselves are closely associated with the running of the Mess. The Cadets Mess is looked after by a Mess Manager. A representative among the cadets is selected as Mess Captain every year.



Infirmary

23. The School has a well maintained infirmary with a resident Nursing Assistant to look after minor ailments of the students and staff. Regular services of a qualified doctor provided by the State Govt. are available thrice a week.

24. Service of doctors of nearby referral hospital are also utilized for emergency cases. Cases needing the attention of specialists are referred to Government Hospital, Goalpara and also some cases are referred to Guwahati Medical College Hospital. Boys are also sent for specialist advice to the nearest Military Hospital, if required. Expenses for the purpose are met by the parents. In case of requirement of prolonged treatment, parents/guardians are informed and boys are sent on leave for medical treatment.

Entertainment

25. Entertainment films are shown to the boys regularly. Instructional films are also screened in the school quite often. DTH connection has been provided to each house to view educational, sports & entertainment programmes.

Shopping Complex

26. The School has a shopping complex to meet day-to-day needs. It consists of a cafeteria, a stationery shop, tailoring shop and a photostat cum book-binding shop.

Guest House / Aramghar

27. Parents / Guardians / Visitors may be allowed to stay in the campus (Aramghar) in case of emergency, subject to availability of accommodation. They are allowed to dine in the Boys' Mess on payment. However, prior confirmation of booking is essential before arrival. The School does not permit parents to stay in the boys' dormitories and residential quarters of the School Staff, except in special cases, where permission is obtained from the Principal. The School has following guest rooms for parents/guests :

- (a) Aramghar (four beds)
- (b) Atithi Shed (five beds)



Interview with the Staff

28. Parents desirous of meeting the Principal and other staff members are advised to take appoinments. Interviews will be granted during working hours only in the office. Parents are advised to avoid meeting Principal, Vice Principal, Admin officer and staff at their residence. Parents are not permitted to visit Hostels and dormitories without permission.



Books and Stationery

29. Text books and essential stationery are supplied by the school to every cadet. The expenditure is met from individual cadet's account.

Daily Routine

30. The Daily Routine includes morning PT/NCC training, morning Assembly, seven periods of instruction, compulsory games in the evening and supervised studies in the afternoon as well as in the evenings. Wednesday afternoons are devoted to hobby clubs. The following is the present daily routine of Cadets which is only illustrative to give a general idea.

Care of Property

31. All property belonging to boys must be clearly marked with indelible ink. Boys are responsible for the care of their own property. Whilst normal precautions are taken, the School cannot accept responsibility for loss or damage in the premises.

32. Any damage caused to the School property by the boys or loss of clothing, books or other articles will be charged from the parents/ guardians concerned.



Indemnity

33. The School has well trained physical and NCC Instructors for conduct of various training activities. Utmost precaution is taken to ensure safety of cadets during conduct of all training activities. However parents at the time of admission have to sign an "Indemnity Bond" specifying that the School authorities will not be liable for any accidental damage on account of injuries, fatal or otherwise, which may be sustained by a cadet at any time during his stay in the School, while taking part in PT, Sports, Athletics, NCC or other extra - curricular activities inside or outside the school.

Vacation

34. The Academic session is from April to March. The School observes two mid-term breaks & during the term in addition to the Summer break in May and June. The duration of vacation is about 70 days.

- (a) Summer break During April, May
- (b) Autumn break During October, November

Note: The scheduled periodicity of vacation is subject to change.

Arrangements for Travel During Vacation

35. All cadets are required to leave the school during vacations. Prior intimation of the vacation period is given to parents. Cadets studying in classes IX to XII are permitted to proceed during vacation on their own. Parents are required to escort the cadets of class VI to VIII.

36. Parents are advised to inform the House Master / authorities about the safe arrival of their sons/ wards at home, during vacation.

37. Late Reporting : Penalty is imposed on cadets who fail to report to the school after vacation or after leave granted to them. Individual students shall be struck of strength after 40 days of absence without permission. In all such cases, parents/ guardians are required to refund Scholarship enjoyed by the students from the Government. Cadets struck off the school strength for absence without leave will be granted re-admission only in cases of absence due to medical reasons. In such cases, the boys are required to pay a re-admission fee.

38. <u>School Webpage</u>: The School webpage is www.sainikschoolgoalpara.org. Information regarding various school activities are updated regularly in the website. All parents are to see the webpage regularly to keep themselves abreast of the latest developments in the School. Progress of the school and activities conducted can be accessed through Facebook page "ProudSSGians".

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School Fees

39. **During Admission.** At the time of admission, total fee is required to be paid by the parents in one instalment. Parents are also required to pay clothing money and miscellaneous expenses along with the fees.

40. <u>Subsequent Years</u> School fees and the other dues are to be paid at the beginning of the School session. The School fee is charged for the full session even if a candidate joins late. However, the payment can be made in instalments but the parent



will have to bear the instalment charges @ 100/- additional per instalment, which is adjusted in 3rd instalment. Schedule of instalment is as given below:-

45. <u>Individual Bank Account</u> All cadets are to open SB account at SBI, Mornai. The State Govt scholarship will be debited directly in the cadet's individual account. The school will not monitor the cadets account. Parents desirous of debiting the scholarship are to provide an undertaking to the school.

46. <u>Scholarship to Cadets</u> The State Government as well as Ministry of Defence awards scholarship to cadets studying in the Sainik Schools on merit-cum-means basis. The award of scholarship, however, is subject to the decision of scholarship granting authories and the school doesn't give any guarantee in this regard. 47. Eligibility Criteria for Defence Scholarship

Cadets will be eligible to receive MoD Scholarships as per the following criteria:-

(a) Cadet is eligible for the continuance of scholarship on the basis of the rank or income of his parents as the case may be.

(b) Obtain a minimum of 55% in aggregate in the annual examination every year with not less that 45% in each subject.

(c) Not reported upon adversely on discipline

(d) SC/ST cadets securing 40% in each subject and 50% in aggregate would be eligible for retention of scholarship






Assam Govt Merit Scholarship

(Other than Defence quota)

48. The Government of Assam grants full merit scholarships to Assam domicile boys in class VI, irrespective of the income of the parents/ guardians. Subsequently the award of scholarship is based on the result in the Tern Examination conducted in the school. In case a boy fails to secure the required percentage of marks in annual examinations award of Scholarship will be stopped. In case of any act of indiscipline, scholarship will be withheld. If the boy is found medically unfit by School Medical authority at any time after admission, the scholarship will be discontinued.



Withdrawal of Cadets.

49. Withdrawal of cadets is resorted to on following grounds : -

(a) **Disciplinary Grounds.** The Principal in the interest of the school and without assigning any reason, can order the withdrawal of a boy should a boy's conduct, behaviour or influence is in the opinion of the Principal in any way detrimental to the principles of the school.

(b) Academic Performance. The Principal can order withdrawal of a cadet from school on the grounds of poor academic performance / poor progress. The fees in respect of such cadets will not be refunded. Any failure in classes IX to XI will result in automatic withdrawal of the cadets from the school and immediate stoppage of scholarship.

(c) <u>Medical Grounds</u>. After admission, if a student is found to be medically unfit in any way which might according to the opinion of the appropriate medical authorities, render him unfit for his future entry into the Regular Armed Forces, the student will be withdrawn at once. However, he may be permitted to continue in the School on payment of full fees from the date the student is found medically unfit, if the Principal permits. He will not to be entitled for any scholarship.

(d) <u>Non -payment of school fees.</u> A student may also be withdrawn on non-payment of fees on due date.

(e) **Requests Made by Parents / Guardians.** In such cases, the Scholarship amount received by them will have to be paid back to the school. Two months notice is required to be given by parents. Failure to give notice will entail the forfeiture of caution money deposited in the school at the time of admission.



Parents Association.

50. Parents Body Meeting is held twice a year. The aims and objectives of this meeting are as under:

- (a) To generate healthy interaction between the parents / guardians and the staff of Sainik School Goalpara.
- (b) To take suggestions of parents/ guardians about the school activities.
- (c) To elect a parents representative for the Local Board of Administration.

Parents Co-operation

51. Parents / guardians are expected to co-operate with the school in its efforts towards maintaining a disciplined academic environment. The school expects the parents to :-

- (a) Equip the boys correctly with all necessary clothing and other requirements.
- (b) Promptly remit the pocket money and incidental charges.

(c) Attend promptly to the circulars issued by the school regarding fees, leave and Progress Report. Comply with instructions regarding extra attention to cadet's studies during vacation period.

(d) Desist from asking for leave for their boys/ wards for attending weddings and other religious functions.

- (e) Ensure that boys rejoin the school punctually after vacations on due date.
- (f) Meet the School authorities when specifically requested to come.
- (g) Send fees and other dues only through bank draft payable at State Bank of India.
- (h) Not to give any valuable articles like mobile phone, I-pod, Walkman, Video game or large sum of money to the cadets.
- (i) Send suggestions for the improvement of the school from time to time .
- (j) Write letters regularly to their Children.
- (k) Last Sunday of each month will be observed as Parents Day.

Avoid visiting the cadets except on the Parents Day and adhere to the timings and other instructions on the subject.

Progress Report

52. Cadets are administered frequent tests to assess their academic progress. Due weightage is also given to class work. A detailed progress report is sent to the parents to apprise them of their wards progress in various spheres of school life during the term. Parents-Teachers meet is also organised to take suggestion from the parents and also to apprise the Parents about their wards performance in different activities of the school.





Cash/ Valuables and Mobile phone

53. Cadets are not allowed to be in possession of cash, valuables such as gold chains or rings, mobiles, tape recorders, I-Pod, DVD, VCD or any other objectionable item or material. Money Orders addressed to the cadets directly in their names are not accepted in the school. Fines will be levied, if cadets are found in possession of these items. Parents are to visit the school, and pay a fine of Rs 5000/- in cash, if cadets are caught with mobiles.

Jurisdiction

54. Parents / guardians of cadets admitted will be deemed to have read/ understood and agreed to the contents of this prospectus.

55. All disputes concerning the school will be subject to Guwahati jurisdiction.

Admission

56. On the basis of an All India Entrance Examination held in the month of January, boys are admitted according to the seats available for the year in class VI & class IX.

Selection Procedure

57. Sainik School Goalpara basically caters for the students from Assam, Meghalaya and Sikkim.

58. Students desirous of getting admission to Sainik School have to undergo a three phase selection procedure. Short listed candidates after Written test undergo Medical test. Students get admission based on the final merit list which depends upon the number of vacancies and candidates position is the order of merit.

(a) Written Test : Conducted generally on the first Sunday of each year. Based on the number of applicants available, examination centres are decided. As of now, the School conducts Entrance Test at Guwahati, Goalpara, Tezpur, Dibrugarh, Shillong & Gangtok. The number of centres are subject to change as per requirment.

(b) Certificates Verification and Counselling : Conducted at 151 Base Hospital, Guwahati during the Medicals.

(c) Medical : Conducted at 151 Base Hospital, Guwahati



Eligibility

59. Age. Age relaxation is not applicable for any category of student.

Boys who have completed 10 but not 12 years on 31 Mar of the year of (a) Class VI admission and passed class V from a recognised School are eligible to appear for class VI.

Boys who have completed 13 but not 15 years on 31 Mar of the year of (b) Class IX admission and passed class VIII from a recognised school are eligible to appear for class IX

Exam Centres 60. Guwahati, Goalpara, Tezpur, Dibrugarh, Shillong & Gangtok (Minimum of twenty five candidates are required for a centre).

61. Students of class VI can appear the entrance test in English, HIndi or Assamese. Language. Students of Class IX can appear only in English.

The centres for the Examination in Assam, Meghalaya and Sikkim will be notified 62. TA/DA. by the School authorities. No TA/DA is admissible for appearing in the examination, Interview, Medical board or re-medical board etc.

The written examination is for 300 marks for class VI and 400 marks for class 63. Syllabus, IX as follows and the question paper is OMR based from Jan 2018 onwards :-

Candidates have to fill up the online application for admission through (www.sainikschoolgoalpara.org) or (sainikschooladmission.in). No applications/ prospectus are sold by the school.

Medical Standards for Admission

64. The same standards of medical fitness as laid down by the Union Public Service Commission for the candidate joining NDA will be applicable to boys seeking admission to Sainik School. Any special, investigation asked for will be at parents 'expense'.

Medical Examination, Certificates Verification and Counselling

65. After the results are announced, successful candidates will be called for Certificates Verification and Counselling and Medical Examination (generally held at 151 Base Hospital, Guwahati) as per promulgated dates.

66. Certificates Verification and Counselling board are to assess the physical fitness, sociability, self confidence and mental alertness of the candidates. The Principal will also have an opportunity to check if any the boys has understated his age irrespective of any other factor. The decision of the Principal is final in respect of admission of a boy to the school.
