HELEN KELLER – TWO INSPIRING INCIDENTS

- Water incident
- gave meaning to her life
- gave her purpose
- gave her motivation to learn
- ✓ When Helen met other blind children at the Perkins Institute- says "what joy to talk with other children in my own language"
 - a barrier that any one might face and recognize
 - faced challenges as part of her existence
 - doesn't make excuses for her shortcoming but learns from "life itself"
- ✓ Some other examples :
 - ➤ Helen gaining control of her life and getting back to her feet after the plagiarism incident

➤ Helen's visit to the Niagara falls – the manner in which Helen becomes one with her environment and mingles with the others around her despite her disability.

OR

HELEN KELLER – IMPORTANCE OF LEARNING

- The realization that everything has a name is important to Keller because she's learned to connect her thoughts and feelings to words and the things she does.
- the feelings that she never knew she had were now shedding light in her dark world.
- Education was key in Helen Keller's life to reveal the things that were unknown to her.
- When her teacher, Anne, spelled water in her hand did the connection with the outside world happen.
- Education becomes a "light" for her.
- She starts to understand that every subject surrounding her has a name, giving to her a thought, and life.
- The realization that everything has a name was so important to Keller because it was the awakening of her curiosity to learn.
- One of the changing moments of her life was when she was finally able to understand the connection between the words she was learning and the objects they represented.

<u>ANNE FRANK – STAY IN THE ANNEXE</u>

Anne considered her family to be fortunate to be living in the annexe.

- quiet / safe
- annexe safe and warm haven
- could use their money to buy food
- Terrible things were happening with poor helpless people who had no place to hide.
- War brought about its share of anxiety, misery and brutality
- In the annexe they could talk about the post war period and look forward to the future

OR

ANNE FRANK – 'KITTY' ANNE'S BEST FRIEND

- Diary an important part of Anne's life
- best friend with whom she could share her thoughts, experiences and feelings
- a great source of comfort for Anne
- The Diary listened without giving any advice.
- helped Anne to fight her loneliness
- It helped Anne to control her feelings because Anne wrote in it all the things she thought about.
- very possessive about the Diary
- a new and strange experience gave Anne a chance to share those feelings which she could not share with anybody else
