Answer:

roo — Matiz = rheumatism

The word 'roo' rhymes with the Kangaroo.

The other word 'Matiz' refers subtly to rheumatism. The word 'rheumatism' has been split in two parts for the sake of rhyme and a disease.

Answer:

Yes, the poem is humorous. Take for example:

“But quite at the end of my tail.”

“And every day a cigar I'll smoke”.
