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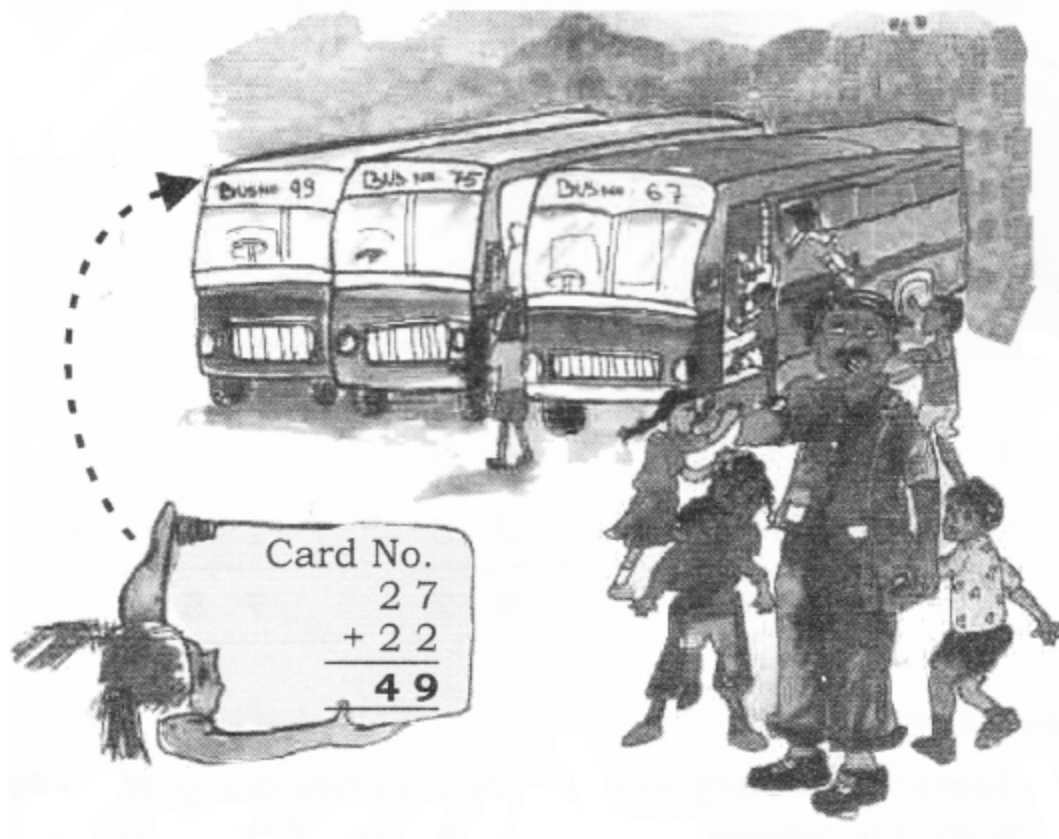

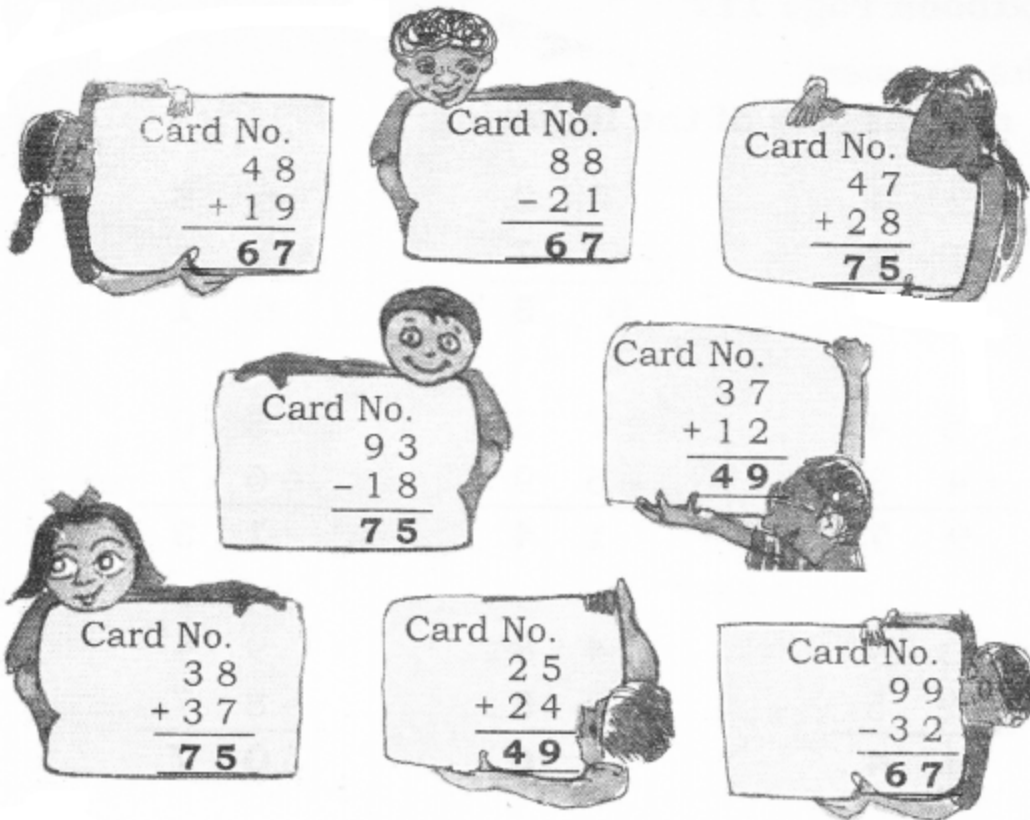
Solve to get the bus number on each card. Match the card with the bus number and see who will sit in which bus.

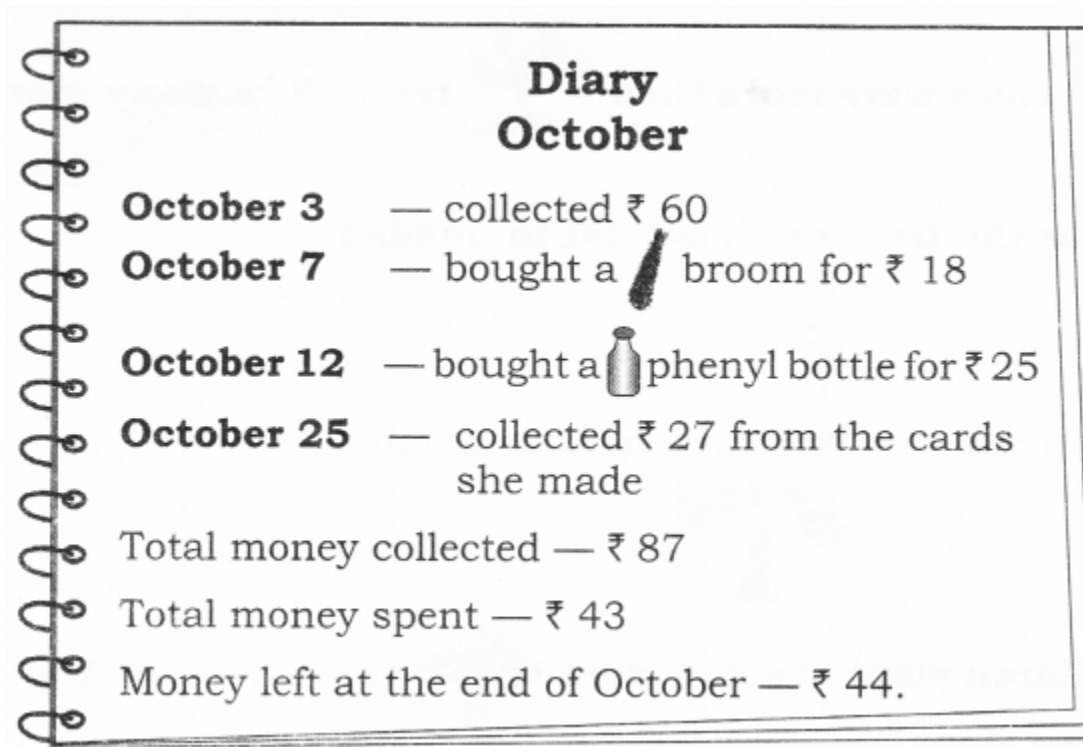
